All information previously shared can be found on our <u>Support for Ukraine webpage</u> – where you will also find our '<u>Ukrainian Guest information hub</u>' which we encourage you to share with your guests. The online information hub is our equivalent of a 'Welcome pack' for guests (we are sharing information digitally so that we are able to keep our information regularly updated, and guests should be able to switch to view in their own language if they wish).

Please note that in addition to these emails, all hosts will receive information from us relating to DBS checks, accommodation checks, £350 monthly host and £350 one-off guest payments; hosts should already have received information from us about this through our welcome email.

At South Cambridgeshire District Council, we have also taken the decision to make available additional 'opt-in' payments of £150 per month to hosts on top of the £350 payments. This is in recognition of the extra costs, particularly rising energy bills, currently being experienced by many households and impacting those hosting guests in their home. Support for Hosts of Ukrainian Families Online Event November 23

The Association for Family Therapy and Systemic Practice (AFT) continues to run online forums where hosts can share ideas on how to help guests who are facing psychological trauma. The next session takes place online on Wednesday, 23 November, from 7.30pm, lasting 90 minutes.

Hosted by Family and Systemic Psychotherapists but with content guided by the participants, the sessions have changed slightly to focus more on hosts coming together to meet each other and share their experiences.

Topics range from self-care to preparing for your guests to arrive, the challenges and opportunities of hosting, accessing resources in your community, thinking about the impact of trauma and help with anonymised specific challenges. Sessions are free but hosts will need to register for tickets.

Free Bizbike Rides

Cambridge Electric Transport operates its Bizbike Community E-bike Services in several South Cambridgeshire communities and is offering free rides to Ukrainian guests. The service is available in the following towns and villages: Northstowe, Longstanton (at Park&Ride), Teversham, The Abingtons and Hardwick.

Ukrainian guests wanting to use the service should email <u>info@bizbike.club</u> indicating their refugee status and they will be sent full instructions and registered for free rides.

Outdoor Forest School – places still available

A special outdoor Forest School, which started at Milton Country Park last weekend, still has a few places available for children aged 8-11 from families who are registered under the Homes for Ukraine scheme in South Cambridgeshire.

The weekly sessions will run for seven weeks offering fresh air, lots of fun activities and a chance to make friends as the children learn through hands-on experience in a natural setting, thereby helping to develop their confidence and self-esteem.

The programme includes bushcraft skills, playing games, making friends, building dens, pond dipping, treasure hunts and lots more. The sessions will be held at the Wild Place at Milton Country Park on Sunday mornings from 10am to 12 noon, continuing from this weekend through to December 18. The activities will be tailored to follow what the group enjoys most, encouraging different ways of communication and entertainment and help for hidden talents to shine.
